²⁸ Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. ²⁹ And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. ³⁰ Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to

Ash Wednesday - You are invited to celebrate Ash Wednesday at 6:30pm on March 2. It will be a hybrid service, with Church of Christ of Granby, UCC invited to join us. The offering will be directed to Neighbors Helping Neighbors Food Pantry. Through Lent the theme will be "Good Enough: Perfection is impossible. Transformation isn't."

One Great Hour of Sharing® is one of four special mission offerings of the

United Church of Christ. This Lenten Offering supports the disaster, refugee, and development ministries of the United Church of Christ within Wider Church Ministries. The theme for 2022 is *Love Remains*, based on 1 Corinthians 13. In the theme scripture, the Apostle Paul helped newly converted Christians at Corinth embrace the

virtue of love. Love is an active decision to think of others before self; to work on behalf of others; and to care for other with acts of kindness and advocacy. Paul taught that community is less about "me" and more about "us." Through your generosity, the United Church of Christ provided support that offered hope during times of despair.
