

Anne Capra, the Planning Director for the Town of South Hadley, wants to meet with members of Center Church to talk about the changing climate and how it impacts you. **Please join the conversation in person on March 19 at 11am in the Meeting House Room**. She is aware we are invested in making wise choices, when it comes to our environment.



Ms Capra wrote, I'm working on a project to gather information on the conditions in people's lives that create vulnerabilities to climate change. Through this information gathering, we will identify a project to address some vulnerability or impact that will strengthen resilience to climate change (improve the communities ability to respond to some aspect of climate change). This project is focused on community members that may be disproportionately affected by the impacts of climate change due to factors such as an inability to have safe and secure housing, fewer or lower paid job opportunities, lack of transportation, social isolation, physical disabilities, food insecurity, or similar challenges. I'm trying to line up meetings with community members in their neighborhoods to hear from them directly so I would be interested in coming to you for this conversation.

The South Hadley Chorale will present its annual concert on Sunday, March 24, 2024, at 3:00 p.m. in Abbey Memorial Chapel at Mount Holyoke College, South Hadley, Massachusetts. The program will feature Gabriel Fauré's *Requiem* and Paul Basler's *Missa Kenya* plus works by Alice Parker and Anita Anderson Cooper. The Harris Brook Elementary School Chorus, from Ludlow, under the direction of Melanie Sroka, will also perform.

Anita Anderson Cooper will conduct. Ms. Anderson Cooper is a well-known area musician, conductor, teacher, and composer. She received degrees from Westminster College, Boston University, and Delta State University. She also directs the chorus of the Paul R. Baird Middle School in Ludlow and conducts the Smith College Handbell Choir.

Tickets may be purchased at the door for \$25 general admission, \$20 for senior citizens, and \$5 for students and children. Tickets may also be purchased prior to the concert day from Chorale members; at the Odyssey Bookshop, South Hadley; or online at www.eventbrite.com for \$20, \$15, and \$5.
